

Jackson Hole Race Camp Itinerary and Information



Thank you for signing up for the 2024 Ski Challenge Race Camp at Jackson Hole.

Dave and I will be driving out to Jackson and arriving on Tuesday, December 3 and staying at the Alpenhof. If anyone needs to get a hold of me my cell number is 952-894-9220. Text or call. If you asked to be on the text list for information updates and dinner plans, I have added you.

Here is a rough itinerary for you to follow. Once the camp starts, your coach will tell you where you will be meeting the remaining days.

Ski Storage: If you are staying at the Alpenhof, there is a ski storage room to the right of the lobby right as you enter. They lock that each night. If you are staying at the Snake River, there is also a ski storage. Check with the front desk.

Dates: Thursday-Saturday, Dec 5, 6, and 7

Camp on Snow time:

9 am - 3 pm

Thursday Gates: 1 - 3 pm

Friday Gates: 1 - 3 pm

Saturday Gates: 10 am - 12 pm (possible timing too)

Video: We will have videographers Thursday and Saturday throughout the day. Video analysis on Thursday and Saturday from approximately 4 pm - the location will more than likely be in the Alpenhof. We are still determining details and will let everyone know.

Meet: First Day 9 am - Meet at the bottom of "Teewinot" lift by the ski racks - This is probably where we will all meet each day. This is just to the right of the gondola entrance as you are looking up the mountain. Right up the steps from the Alpenhof.

Coaches: We will be dividing up into 3 groups. You are welcome to group with friends you are traveling with if preferred - please let us know when we are dividing into groups. There will be 6 per group. Coaches usually rotate each day so that you get coaching from many different perspectives.

Lunches: We will have roughly an hour each day for lunch. Usually, each group decides on a place to eat. You are also welcome to go back to your hotel room and eat or eat somewhere different from your group.

Saturday afternoon: Saturday afternoon - You will have the choice to stay on the groomed runs with a coach and work on race and drills or you can break off with a coach and "free-ski" wherever the mountain is open. We will divide up after lunch that day.

What to wear: Most people wear comfortable snow pants and jackets during the camp. Some will add padding when running gates or wear a GS suit under jackets during gates. Some wear a GS suit for timed runs on Saturday morning. We will not be figuring handicaps.

Dinners, we usually try and all meet at the same place. This is not required, however. If you would like to be included in a text group, let me know by texting to my number 952-894-9220 if you haven't already. I try and just pick a place and make a reservation for the group.
